BEING A WRITER WHO TRANSLATES AND A TRANSLATOR WHO WRITES. PANEL DISCUSSION.

Both writers and translators need a keen sense of words and meanings, so it is not surprising that sometimes, rather than being separate professions, these two activities combine, opening up new creative horizons and enriching the authors' own style and native literary traditions.

During the panel, well-known author/translators will share their experiences working in these dual or overlapping creative literary practices. They will discuss the phenomenon of combining two professions, its challenges and discoveries, and what it adds to the books on their way to the reader.

During the event, the panelists will discuss how book illustration managed to preserve and develop its unique style amidst all the tragic events of the 20th century, will talk about illustration and the Ukrainian avant-garde, the Sixties, children's illustration of the 70s and 80s, and how this history helps and inspires the current generation of book illustrators.
